Latest Public Health Wiltshire COVID advice

We have consulted Public Health Wiltshire who have provided updated guidance that if you/your child:

- has been in close contact with a positive case (such as a household member)

- is displaying covid-19 symptoms

- and has tested positive on an LFD (but subsequently tested negative on a PCR test)

you/they are treated as covid positive and should isolate for 10 days from the start of symptoms.

National guidance remains clear that if you/your child still feels unwell after a negative test, you/they should stay at home until feeling better.

Whilst lateral flow tests are not usually recommended for primary-age children, the latest Public Health Wiltshire advice is that primary pupils who are identified by NHS Test and Trace as close (or household) contacts can undertake daily testing whilst waiting for the results of a PCR (at the discretion of parents).
