Potential Industrial Action – January 2023

Most of the teacher, leadership and support staff unions are currently balloting their members nationally to ask if they would be willing to undertake strike action and/or industrial action to seek a better pay deal from the government. The outcome of these ballots will be known in early January 2023, with any action likely to take place in late January 2023.

Dr Patrick Roach, NASUWT General Secretary, said "The profession has endured more than a decade of real terms pay cuts," adding that "it is outrageous that we are seeing teachers' living standards falling at a time when the country should be investing more in securing children's education recovery after the pandemic".

We do not yet know the extent to which proposed strike and/or industrial action may disrupt the running of our schools, but in line with DfE guidance we will "take all reasonable steps to keep the school[s] open for as many pupils as possible" as long as it is safe to do so.

As soon as we have more information about any proposed industrial action, we will communicate with you as early as we can to help us all manage the logistics and any disruption to the normal running of our schools.

Trust Investment Fund Bids Successful

Each year, schools contribute to an Investment Fund budget which can be bid against to deliver projects across the Trust. Using this pot, as well as some school underspends, we have been able to commission £140k of school improvement work on projects such as: improving premises; reducing energy costs through LED lighting and improving insulation; purchasing IT equipment; funding additional teacher time to drive outcomes; leading art projects; and launching new phonics schemes.
